

This was followed with a talk about how studying a language can open all sorts of doors to future careers and we had a talk about what studying a language would be like at university from a tutor at Royal Holloway University.


"The event was really interesting and I learnt a lot about what it would be like if I were to take a language through to university." (Thamilavai Vahisan)

Bebras Challenge 2022

The **Bebras Computing Challenge** introduces computational thinking to students. It is organized in over 50 countries and designed to get students all over the world excited about computing.

Herschel Grammar provided the opportunity to all the students in the cohort to take part in the first round in which each participant answered questions online at school, that were focused on computational and logical thinking.

87 students in our school received the **Gold Award** in the Bebras Computational Thinking Challenge. This is a proud moment for the students as they worked hard to achieve this award and be in the **top 10%** of the all those who took up this challenge (360,000 in 2022)!

Next, they will be invited to the **online Oxford University Computing Challenge** which takes place in the week beginning 16th Jan 2023. Best of luck to our students!


Antibullying Week 2022
